

It won't be long until visions of sugarplums are dancing in our heads, along with visions of quiet, snowy streets lined with luminaries!

The popular Christmas Eve tradition, which dates back to 1958, returns this year with Diane Becker and Alice Peterson taking the reins for Gladys Hertzberg, who stepped down this year after nearly 40 years as coordinator. The candles and bags have already been ordered, and we are now contacting "block captains" for distribution.

You can help spread the word to neighbors on streets that haven't participated in the past

by volunteering as a block captain. Captains contact their neighbors, take orders and payments, and distribute candle/bag kits. Some captains host a holiday party and pass out candles, while others make a day or two available for neighbors to stop by and pick up their kits. Either way, it's a nice opportunity to share the holiday spirit with your family, friends and neighbors and light up Waterbury for the holidays.



Waterbury Unveils New Decorative Street Sign Topper



Signs like this will appear atop street signs throughout the neighborhood in 2015.

Soon you will definitely know when you have arrived in Waterbury.

At the conclusion of the 2010 Waterbury Garden Tour, a decision was made to use some of the proceeds for decorative street signs designating the Waterbury neighborhood. After several years work and negotiation by many dedicated volunteers, the Association has reached an agreement with the city on the design and tentative placement of these signs.

As part of this agreement, the city will install signs that will sit on top of approximately 40 street/stop signs at various locations throughout the neighborhood. The signs measure 18" in length by 10" high and will be black powder coated steel with an aluminum insert to ensure visibility and durability.

Although we hoped the installation could begin this year, it will likely occur throughout 2015. The city has agreed to pay for the hardware for mounting the signs and will cover half the cost of installation. This is the first project of its kind in the city so we are excited to see the final results.

Extra signs will be available for neighbors who would like to own one of their own. More details will be provided soon. In the meantime, questions can be directed to Tom McBride (515) 771-8248.

Needed Repairs Coming to Historic Billy Goat Bridge

If you haven't found or travelled the Billy Goat Bridge, make it an adventure to find this hidden spot in Waterbury. The Billy Goat Bridge connects North Waterbury Road and Waterbury Circle and has been in the neighborhood for decades.

Neighborhood kids use the bridge to get to and from Hanawalt and Merrill. In the past, the bridge was used not only for kids to get to school, but for house staff to get to their jobs within the neighborhood. In fact, if you look closely, you can still see the old steps underneath the existing bridge.

Thanks to local neighbor, John McGinnis for informing WNA that the bridge was in serious disrepair. The concrete at the entrance of the bridge was eroding and the wood

railings and steps were rotting. Thanks are also due to Christine Hensley, our city council member. As soon as Chris became aware of the dangers associated with the bridge, she began work with the city to implement a plan for repair. At this time the concrete has been replaced and work on the bridge itself has commenced. By the time you read this, we hope the bridge will be ready for regular traffic once again!
