Billy Goat Bridge Spring Painting

The wooden walk bridge and accompanying stairways have, for decades, provided scenic access over the creek that divides Waterbury Circle from North Waterbury Road. The bridge is a beloved fixture in the neighborhood and has provided a great shortcut to Hanawalt and Merrill for many a student over the years. Not to mention an interesting diversion to neighborhood walkers. This painting completes the two-year bridge upgrade project. The structural repairs were undertaken by the WNA in 2015.

The amazing group of volunteers ranged from age 5 on up. A visiting grandparent even grabbed a brush and joined the fun. The significant project was able to be completed in less than three hours due to the great turnout of neighbors. Cookies, doughnuts, and of course paint brushes were provided to all. 

Admission is free courtesy of your Waterbury Neighborhood Association (WNA).


